

Inter-Agency Child Protection in Emergencies Coordination Training



What is it?

A 5-day training focussing on building skills and transferring knowledge to promote effective coordination of child protection in emergencies work. The training will have a special focus on strengthening co-leadership for coordination structures.

Who is it for?

This training is designed for people already involved or likely to be involved in child protection in emergencies coordination – either as a coordinator or member – or leading on a particular thematic or technical area within a coordination group. Persons involved in coordination of other clusters

looking to improve linkages with the child protection sub-cluster are also encouraged to apply. The training is particularly appropriate for staff from government, UN, and NGO humanitarian agencies who want to strengthen their coordination skills or strengthen their involvement in coordination. Countries with or interested in **co-leadership arrangements** between government, UN and NGO agencies will be prioritised.

What will you learn?

By the end of the training, child protection Coordinators should:

- Develop a clear understanding of humanitarian reform and the cluster approach;
- Understand the functions, roles and responsibilities of sub-cluster coordination;
- Develop strategies to encourage and develop strong collaboration and partnerships;
- Know how to access and use key tools and resources important to sub-cluster coordination;
- Increase the capacity of participants for more effective sub-cluster coordination.

Where and when?

Two trainings will be held:

- Dakar, Senegal, 16-20 June (French)
- Thailand, Bangkok, 1-5 December (English)
